Austrian Vineyard Trains

This unique tour will take you to Lower Austria's most beautiful areas in the Weinviertel ("wine quarter"), the Waldviertel ("forest quarter") and the Mostviertel ("cider quarter"). Experience the 500-year-old history of one of the most beautiful post gothic castles in Europe, Tratzberg, which is located in a beautiful hillside overlooking the Inn Valley. We also suggest a visit to the charming medieval town Rattenberg, the smallest town in Austria.

Visit Ambras castle, one of the most important sights of Innsbruck. Also recommended is a trip up to the mountain range "Nordkette" on the outskirts of Innsbruck. Enjoy the impressive views while having coffee and cake. Another highlight worth visiting is the spectacular Swarovski Crystal World in Wattens.

The landmark of Kufstein is the impressive fortress which sits high above the town. The charm and attraction of this town lies in its contrasts, which you can discover while wandering through the streets.

A scenic excursion through picturesque Tyrol will take you to the famous mountain resort Kitzbühel, where we suggest a horse and carriage ride, and to Ellmau, where you can take a

cable car ride up the mountain "Hartkaiser" for a marvellous view of the surrounding area.

Spring and summer in Salzkammergut

Come with us to the lakes of the Austrian Prealps. Into the heart of the country, where the Emperor and his entourage used to spend their summer holidays. More than 100 years later, this diverse region has become even more attractive.

Travel to Hallstatt, which is the archaeological heart of the World Heritage Region and is home to the world's oldest salt mines. Visitors from around the world flock to the historic village centre and love to stroll along the path along the shore of Lake Hallstatt. Your local city guide will show you the best photo spots during the guided tour. Afterwards in only a few minutes, the Salzbergbahn funicular will take you on a steep ascent ending 360 meters above the rooftops of Hallstatt. A panoramic bridge will lead you to the Rudolf's Tower. Then, suddenly, it lies there before you: an imposing 12-meters-long lookout platform extending out into the void like the points of a star - the Hallstatt Skywalk. During your tour through the salt mine you can feel the very breath of those far-distant times, as you roam the tunnels, stroke the roughly hewn rock walls with your hand and hurtle down the 64 meters-long miners' slide. Last but not least in our cavalcade of superlatives: Amid the prehistoric tunnels, the oldest wooden staircase in Europe was discovered, used by people some 2800 years ago to carry "white gold" out of the mountain.

Your next stop will be the picturesque St. Gilgen on the shore of the lake Wolfgangsee. Continue by boat across the dark, clear waters of the lake to St. Wolfgang. Journey on with the traditional rack railway, which takes you idyllically and comfortably up the 1,783 m high Schafberg. Austria's steepest steam cogwheel railway has been running from St. Wolfgang up the Schafberg since 1893. In 35 minutes it climbs 1,190 metres in altitude and 5.85 km to the top of the Schafberg.

Enjoy a unique excursion to mountain Dachstein. You'll take the Dachstein Krippenstein cable car to the Schönbergalm middle station, where an exciting guided tour through the Dachstein Giant Ice Cave OR the Mammut Cave awaits you. The name Mammut Cave was chosen by explorers due to the astonishing dimensions of the underground spaces and passageways contained within this cave system. At present, more than 70 km of these passageways have been explored - around 1 km of them can be viewed during the guided tours. The completely reconstructed Dachstein Giant Ice Cave offers you the chance to embark on a breathtaking adventure through rock and ice. After you can then enjoy a delicious ,Bratl' in one of the two restaurants. Last point of the trip is the 5fingers viewing platform. It offers an adrenaline rush at the highest level. This is probably the most spectacular viewing platform in the Alps and reaches out like a hand over the 400 m drop. Over 5 platforms (the 5fingers), each in a different design, you can put your head for heights to the test and enjoy unique views down over Hallstatt, the Hallstättersee lake and the inner Salzkammergut region.

Visit the famous flower parade of Kirchberg where every year on the 15th of August the pedestrian area in the centre of the village becomes the meeting point for old and young as live bands and stalls provide entertainment as well as food and drink. The highlight of the day is the parade of "flower sculptures" made out of over 500,000 flowers.

Take a round trip through the magnificent landscape of Tyrol and visit the largest lake of Tyrol, Achensee. We recommend a ride with the unique steam train from Jenbach to Seespitz. Enjoy a drive along the Ziller Valley to the town Mayrhofen and experience the 500-year-old history of one of the most beautiful post gothic castles in Europe, Tratzberg. We also suggest a visit to the charming mediaeval town of Rattenberg, the smallest town in Austria. Visit Kufstein, a town of contrasts, with its impressive fortress that sits high above the old town.

Tip

Why not enjoy a ride up one of the many cable cars in the region? A journey to the top of the mountains is always a breath-taking experience.

Enjoy a day in the Großglockner Resort Matrei-Kals and take the gondola up the mountain to Adler Lounge from where you will have a breath-taking view.

Austria is famous for its music, but perhaps it is even better known as the setting of the popular musical The Sound of Music that has enchanted audiences from all over the world and infused them with the desire to see the picturesque towns, glittering lakes and majestic mountains for themselves.

Take a day trip into the beautiful Salzkammergut, Austria's lake district. We recommend you visit the pretty town of Bad Ischl with the Imperial Villa as well as taking a cruise on one of the many lakes and a ride to the top of a mountain by cog railway or cable car.

One of the absolute highlights of this journey is a visit to the magnificent city of Salzburg. Your guide will take you on a special tour of the city of music and show you all the sights as well as the places where The Sound of Music was filmed in 1964. Be sure to try the famous Mozartkugeln, delicious orbs of marzipan and nougat covered in chocolate. In the evening a further highlight awaits you: the Sound of Salzburg Dinner & Show.

Why not visit the Eisriesenwelt Cave at Werfen, the world's largest ice cave? Good shoes and warm clothes are essential as you enter this wonder world of ice formations. You can also visit Hohenwerfen Castle, a mediaeval fortress with a falconry and a bird of prey show.

Here you will participate in a hands-on Mozartkugel show at Café Dallmann. Experience how the famous confectionery is made and dip one into the chocolate yourself. Afterwards you can enjoy some coffee and cake on the café's terrace.

Finally your journey will take you to Austria's capital, Vienna. Enjoy a city tour and stop at the famous Hotel Sacher for a piece of the world-famous Sacher cake and a hot drink. A further highlight is a visit to the Hofburg, the former residence of the Austrian Emperors.

Dachstein – Adventures on Every Level

Discover the amazing region around the Dachstein glacier. Enjoy the stunning views, collect some unbelievable impressions and get to know the beautiful country of Salzburg.

Start your stay with the visit of the distillery Mandelberggut. During a guided tour you will learn more about the production of their natural products made out of local plants and fruits. Of course some tasting of the products must not be missed! Afterwards the Dachstein cable car will take you up on the Dachstein glacier from where you can enjoy a unique panorama experience, the Skywalk, one of the most spectacular viewing platforms made out of glass. You will also visit the Ice Palace, a seductive and mystical world of ice and snow deep inside the Dachstein glacier. The Stairway to Nothingness, 14 narrow steps down to a glass platform, and the Suspension Bridge will guarantee remarkable views across the mountains.

Discover the wild-romantic Wörschach gorge. Over millions and millions of years the river has carved its way through the stone and formed the gorge. On your way through you will get to see many natural monuments alongside the canyon. The trail will lead you to the lake Spechtensee and the ruins of Wolkenstein castle. Afterwards your coach will take you to Admont where the famous Benedictine monastery is situated. During your guided tour you will see the world's biggest monastic library, the monastery church and the museum.

Head to the Ausseerland where you will visit the scenic towns Bad Aussee, famous for the Daffodil Festival, and Altaussee. The 3-lakes-tour starts at the lake Grundlsee. From there a motorboat will bring you the 6.5 km over to the other side of the lake. After a short walk you will arrive at the mysterious Toplitzsee where you will get back on your boat and make your journey to the romantic Kammersee passing beautiful waterfalls. There you will also get to see the origin of the river Traun. The Hochwurzen cable car will take you up to the peak. The new gondolas are made entirely out of glass and offer breath-taking views of the Dachstein massif. After reaching the top you can take the opportunity to go for a walk or hike, or use the amenities of the mountain restaurant for some sun bathing. In the afternoon you can take a mountain go-kart on a speedy 7km long ride back down to the valley.

Another highlight is the city of Salzburg, the home to Mozart and The Sound of Music, where your will meet your guide for the city tour. He will introduce you to the city's most famous sights such as Mirabell Palace, Mozart's Residence and Birthplace or the picturesque Getreidegasse. We highly recommend a ride up to the spectacular fortress Hohensalzburg, which sits high above the rooftops of the city. In the afternoon your journey will take you to Hallein, to the salt mine. At Durrnberg near Hallein the oldest mine in the world is open to visitors. More than 2500 years ago, the Celts were already mining this precious mountain resource, as is evident from the traces they left behind. Warm clothes and

Little Trains of Lower Austria

Though not as well-known as the western parts, Austria's east has a whole lot to offer.

This programme is based at the Naturhotel Steinschalerhof, a family-run hotel offering delicious home-cooked meals and a cosy atmosphere. The hotel has its own nature garden and produces its own herbs and vegetables. It is ideally situated for a number of excursions into the surrounding area.

A tasty welcome drink, an after-dinner Most (cider) degustation, a guided tour through the hotel's garden and an evening with traditional Lower Austrian live music are just a few examples for the extras this hotel offers to enhance your stay.

Make your way to Puchberg, from where the famous "Salamander Train" will take you to the Hochschneeberg, with its 2,075 meters, Lower Austria's highest mountain and a very popular excursion destination. From its top you can see the mountains Rax, Ötscher and Hochschwab and the lakes Neusiedl and Balaton in Hungary. The Schneeberg is an ideal location to go for a walk. However, there are also some typical and rustic taverns such as Fischerhütte, Damböckhaus or Berghaus Hochschneeberg. Afterwards the train will take you back to Puchberg.

Another great excursion leads you into the Danube valley. Visit Melk, where you experience a guided tour of the magnificent baroque Abbey. Afterwards you will board the Wachaubahn, a train that will take you through the gentle rolling hills and the vineyards along the banks of the Danube to Krems. Here you can visit the winery Sandgrube 13 and take a tour of the vineyards as well as sampling some of the produce. Alternatively we recommend the beautiful Grafenegg Castle where seven centuries of history are clearly visible in the architecture. During a guided tour you can find stylistic traces from Gothic through Baroque and Biedermeier to elegant Neo-Gothic.

The famous Mariazellerbahn, also known as the Himmelstreppe ("Stairway to Heaven"), takes you straight to the town of Mariazell. Since 1330 – and to the present day – Mariazell and its basilica have been an official place of pilgrimage. After gathering first impressions of this unique town you will enjoy lunch in the Hotel Drei Hasen. In the afternoon you can visit the gingerbread factory Pirker where you can learn many new things about the

production and decoration of gingerbread. Of course a tasting is also essential. Don't miss the famous pilgrimage basilica of Mariazell – we recommend a guided tour.

Tip:

Extend your holiday to include a day-trip to nearby Vienna, Austria's magnificent capital, or explore the Kamp valley. Here you can visit Arche Noah ("Noah's Ark"), a garden and a seed bank dedicated to the preservation and regeneration of crop diversity. We also recommend Kittenberger gardens, a harmonic wonderland amidst the rolling hills of Langenlois. Enjoy a picnic in the beautiful gardens and explore the routes through this unique place during a guided tour. Another experience you're sure to enjoy is a visit to the world of wine at Loisium. Join an expedition with all your senses, learn about winemaking in Austria's largest wine growing town and take a closer look at the region and its tradition of winemaking – including a tasting of course!

Silent Night – Christmas Markets in Salzburg and Tyrol

Enjoy the splendour of Salzburg, the atmosphere of Austria's Christmas markets and discover the origins and legacy of the world's most famous Christmas carol: Silent Night, Holy Night. Since they were written in the early 19th century the original German lyrics have been translated into more than 300 languages and dialects and spread to the four corners of the world. In 2001 UNESCO declared the carol an intangible cultural heritage in Austria. Two men are credited with creating this song: The curate Joseph Mohr who wrote the lyrics and the schoolteacher and Organist Franz Xaver Gruber who composed the melody. Wander in their footsteps and see the places that inspired them to create this immortal piece of music.

Make your way to Austria and check in at your hotel in the Salzburg area. Immerse yourself in the pre-Christmas atmosphere with some hot punch or mulled wine and Christmas biscuits before dinner.

Start your journey of discovery, looking for the origins of Silent Night. Your trip will first take you to Oberndorf where you will visit the Silent-Night-Chapel, built in place of the former St. Nicholas Church where the carol was performed for the first time on Christmas Eve 1818 by its two creators. Continue to Hochburg-Ach, the birthplace of Franz Xaver Gruber with its museum dedicated to the composer. Next you will stop at Arnsdorf to visit the Silent Night Museum before you make your way to the magnificent city of Salzburg, forever linked with W.A. Mozart and The Sound of Music. After a lunch break, your guide will meet you to show you the most important sights. At the end of the guided tour, you will have some free time to explore the city on your own or to get some Christmas shopping done. Depending on your interests, you can visit the Mozart House, the Salzburg Fortress, Schloss Mirabell or the Salzburg Museum (which among many other interesting artefacts houses the oldest extant autograph of Silent Night, Holy Night by Joseph Mohr). In the evening, you can enjoy an optional Musical experience, the Sound of Salzburg Show, that incorporates songs from the popular musical The Sound of Music as well as some of Mozart's masterpieces.

Embark on an excursion into Tyrol. Make a stop in Kufstein, the region's second-largest town and home of the artist and priest Josef Muhlbacher who created the monument to Franz Xaver Gruber and Josef Mohr in Oberndorf. Take a stroll through the beautiful old town centre watched over by the majestic fortress. Be sure not to miss the large Heldenorgel (heroes' organ) which is played every day at noon and can be heard for miles around. Continue your journey to Fügen. Here you can visit the Museum at Widumspfiste, a folk museum that also documents how Silent Night, Holy Night spread throughout the world. Afterwards you will see baroque Schloss Fügen, where the then relatively new carol was performed in 1822 for the Austrian Emperor Franz I. and the Russian Czar Nicolas I. Journey on to the lake Wallersee and Gut Aiderbichl, a former farming estate that was turned into a pet sanctuary.

Visit Gmunden, a town famous for its very distinct style of traditional Austrian pottery. Take a tour of the Gmundner manufactory, the largest ceramic-manufacturer in central Europe, and learn

how pottery has been made here since 1492. Afterwards continue along the lake Traunsee to Bad Ischl. Admire the Kaiservilla, the imperial villa, before your journey takes you onwards to Hallstatt. Probably the most photographed village in the area, Hallstatt is a UNESCO world heritage site that has fascinated visitors from all over the world so much that an exact (mirrored) copy was constructed in China.

Discover the park and its gardens with all their glory and enjoy the variety of this island with all your senses. Visit the principality of Liechtenstein, where we recommend a guided round trip of this tiny country. Also worth a visit is Werdenberg, a small medieval wooden town, and St. Gallen. Follow this with a visit to the Bentele Schnapps distillery and beekeepers. If you have a sweet tooth, Maestrani's Chocolarium, a world of Swiss chocolate, is just the thing for you. To beer lovers we heartily recommend a visit of the Fohrenburger beer brewery in Bludenz or to Hopfengut No. 20 in Tettnang. Those who delight in history and architecture may want to visit Meersburg Old or New Castle and the beautiful Salem Monastery and Palace. If technology peaks your interest, a visit to the Zeppelin Museum in Friedrichshafen and to the Rolls-Royce Museum in Dornbirn will be most enjoyable.

Visit České Budějovice, home to the Budvar brewery, where we recommend a guided city tour and a visit of the beer brewery. Then continue to the town of Český Krumlov, a picturesque gem and one of the most popular places in central Europe. Follow in the footsteps of our ancestors and gain better insight into life in a medieval castle as you learn about the history of the Counts of Clam who have been living here for over 550 years. Your tour starts in the three-story inner courtyard, then continues on through the pharmacy, the Gothic chapel and the armory, ending in the residential apartments of the Counts of Clam, where you will find a large collection of fine 18th century furniture

Cross the border into the Czech Republic and the town of Český Krumlov, listed as an UNES-CO World Heritage Site since 1992, and classed as one of the most beautiful and best-preserved towns in the Czech Republic. The town experienced its greatest prosperity during the years 1302-1602 when it lay on the crossroads between the Czech Republic, Austria, Bavaria and Northern Italy. Now a lively cosmopolitan town with a unique atmosphere, it is still dominated by its castle and nestled in unspoiled countryside. Make the most of your visit with a guided tour through the streets and narrow lanes of the town.

On the way back to Austria we recommend stopping at the Lipno Dam, an artificial lake created by damming the waters of the Vltava. Why not enjoy a boat cruise here?

A further highlight is the little known city of Olomouc. The central streets are dotted with beautiful churches, a testament to the city's long history as a bastion of the Catholic Church. Explore the foundations of the ancient castle, then head for one of the city's many pubs or microbreweries. Don't forget to try the cheese, Olo-

moucký sýr or tvarůžky, reputedly the smelliest in the country. Allow yourself to be enchanted by the gardens in Kroměříž. During the summer Kroměříž is reminiscent of the Garden of Eden and represents a perfect symbiosis of light, plants, water, art and architecture.
